NEW ELECTRONIC BIKE LOCKERS AT THE ALAMEDA MAIN STREET FERRY TERMINAL

- WHO:** San Francisco Bay Ferry
- WHAT:** SF Bay Ferry will install 20 new electronic bicycle lockers at the Alameda Main Street Ferry Terminal. These new lockers will be available for anyone to use on a first come, first served basis. The cost to park a bike will be 5 cents per hour, and the maximum time allowed to park a bike is 10 days.
- The City of Alameda's current manual lockers at the terminal will be removed. Alameda will no longer maintain a waitlist for bicycle lockers.
- The project is funded by the Water Emergency Transportation Authority and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA).
- WHEN:** Lockers will be available beginning February 23, 2016.
- WHERE:** Alameda Main Street Terminal
- MORE INFORMATION:** BikeLink cards can be [purchased online, or in retail establishments](#). In Alameda, you can purchase BikeLink cards at Alameda Bicycle (1522 Park Street). The cards are also sold at the Ferry Building, at Bay Crossings (Stall #22).

- BACKGROUND:** The new, shared-use electronic bicycle lockers will use the [BikeLink system](#), which is commonly seen throughout the Bay Area and at BART stations. BikeLink allows bicyclists to park their bicycles in a secure, on-demand bicycle locker using a BikeLink card.
- In Alameda, there are already shared-use lockers using the BikeLink system, at the Civic Center Garage (1442 Oak St), the Harbor Bay Ferry Terminal, and at Alameda Landing.
